Peacefully positioned to the rear of a striking Regency townhouse on Brunswick Terrace, this one-bedroom apartment enjoys quiet tranquillity while remaining close to the city centre and beach. Inside, it has been beautifully maintained and styled to create a homely space which is ready to move straight into.



The townhouses of Brunswick Terrace are undoubtedly the most impressive along Hove Seafront with ornate architectural mouldings and Corinthian pilasters in buttery Hove Cream. Attractive on the approach, stone steps rise to a grand portico entrance and into the communal hallway where the scale of the building becomes apparent. Taking stairs to the first floor, this apartment is neatly tucked away to the rear so you cannot hear any noise from the road, yet the beach is there on your doorstep when you need it!

Entering a long and well-lit corridor, limed oak floorboards and soft white walls greet you. This fresh, neutral palette continues throughout the flat, brightening each room, pairing well with all styles of furnishing. First to the left, the living room is partially open plan to the kitchen which sits nicely tucked away. There is ample space for relaxation and formal dining below the tall sash window, alongside the kitchen where a peninsula island creates a second informal dining space with a breakfast bar to seat two. Cream Shaker cabinetry provides a wealth of storage alongside a butler sink and integrated appliances which sit below marble worktops.

Moving through the flat, the bathroom has been recently renovated with floor to ceiling stone tiles and a contemporary walk-in shower cubicle with brushed gold fittings and a rainfall showerhead. Nearby, the bedroom is a cosy double room with a high ceiling and space for several pieces of freestanding bedroom furnishings within the alcoves.


